There will be lots of different stalls, fun and activities, and all money raised will go towards educational equipment and opportunities for the pupils. Please do consider going straight over from 11.30am Mass that week, or later in the afternoon.

SUMMARY OF WELLSPRING PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

We had a very successful and enjoyable Wellspring Parish Council meeting on Tuesday night, when we discussed the pastoral priorities established at the meeting in November. All participants were invited to choose a priority and discuss in a small group the progress, current situation and possible future development.

For the next few weeks we'll have a spotlight on the various priorities. This week the spotlight is on: Parish Fabric

- the small group spoke about the noticeable improvements especially at St Anthony's: the heating system running well; the new church carpet; the side chapel refurbishment; as well as the improved sound system and smooth livestream in both churches. Fr Stephen added that the improvements at St Mark's are either less noticeable (new disability access ramp for the hall; hall pathway lighting and slabbing; insulation in the parish house and church; addressing damp in the choir loft) or are in progress (destratification fans for the church [see below]; solution to damp above the choir area; disability access ramp for the church). The Fabric Committee has worked very hard on these issues and deserves a lot of congratulations.

- the small group noted ongoing problems as follows: heating at St Mark's during the winter; question over the future of halls for both churches; St Anthony's grounds needing cleared of weeds; and the future of St Anthony's chapel house. Fr Stephen explained the idea behind the destratification fans for St Mark's church: they are used in supermarkets, airports, factories etc, and they circulate the air by pushing a jet of air downwards from ceiling level. In this way the strata (hottest air high up in the building; coldest at the bottom, and varying degrees in the middle) are equalised, so that more of the warm air remains where it is needed, at pew level. They will be installed very soon. Look out also for an announcement very soon which should clarify the future use of St Anthony's house, hall and side chapel. Please also see the request below for volunteers to help weed the St Anthony's grounds next weekend. If we have enough budget for this year (after the modifications which may be necessary once we have completed an inventory of fire safety and health and safety), the first 'luxury' item will be the renovation of the underside of the kneelers at St Mark's.

- the small group noted finally that if all parishioners continue to take pride in our buildings and respond in small ways when they see an opportunity to keep the parish buildings neat and tidy, it will really help to keep our parish fabric in good shape.

ST MARK'S FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND NEW SCOTS THANKS

What a weekend we had at St Mark's last week! Between the First Holy Communion on Saturday and the Thanksgiving Mass and New Scots celebration on Sunday, there was joy in abundance. A huge thank you to everyone involved in the preparation and organisation of these events, especially the parents, school, musicians and New Scots team.
