SUMMARY OF WELLSPRING PARISH COUNCIL MEETING: Sacramental preparation

- the small group discussing this theme felt that the parish had responded well to the varying requests for sacramental preparation over the past months (a mixture of larger group responses such as Alpha; small group catechesis of children who find themselves outwith the Catholic school system; and empowering parents to engage with the diocesan workbooks). A specific challenge going forward is support of New Scots children who are directed to non-denominational primary schools when they arrive in our area. The meeting noted that attendance at a Catholic school and taking advantage of the excellent sacramental preparation provided by our schools remains the norm and should always be promoted.
- the small group felt that continuing and developing a welcoming environment in the parish e.g. by encouraging the role of the Ministers of Welcome, normalising New Scots culture, reaching out to families whose children attend non-denominational schools for whatever reason, and ecumenical acceptance, should hopefully bring many people to seek sacramental preparation in the years to come. Involving volunteers who are not necessarily teachers in sacramental preparation would give ownership to the whole parish.
