## SYNOD ON SYNODALITY FINAL PHASE

The gathering this month is the last part of the discernment phase of the synodal process begun in 2021. Encouraging us to ever greater co-operation among us as clergy and lay faithful, Pope Francis opened the session by reminding us, ""Never can a bishop, or any other Christian, think of himself 'without others," he continued. "Just as no one is saved alone, the proclamation of salvation needs everyone and requires that everyone be heard."
